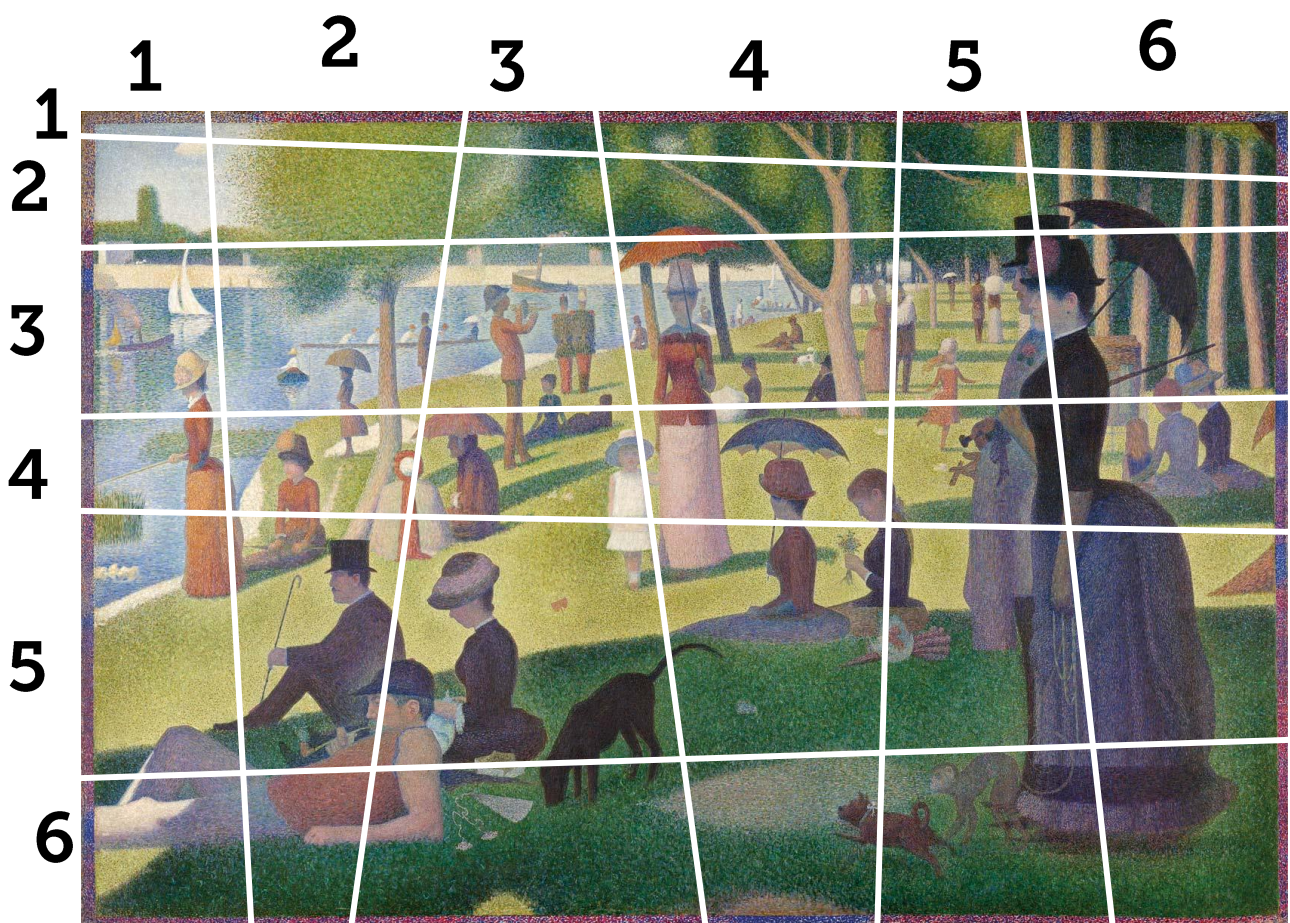


Seurat's Sixes

Georges Seurat (1859 –1891) was a French post-Impressionist artist. He is best known for devising the painting technique known as pointillism.

Create an amazing 36-word chance poem!

1. Roll a dice twice. Use the numbers to identify a section of the Seurat painting.
2. Describe the section in exactly six words.
3. Repeat steps one and two, five times.
4. Assemble your six, six-line descriptions into a 36-word poem.
5. Extension: Make 1 change to each line. Make the poem together with friends and family.

4,2 Sitting on the grass, my hat
 5, 1 Green by water, orange, white stripe
 3, 6 Dark woods, umbrella by my ear
 6, 5 Green dark, the monkey, the dog
 1, 5 Fading going dark a tree branch
 2, 4 The Curved trees, the mottled leaves,

1 Change per line, reassembled

*The Curved trees, and mottled leaves,
 On the grass, in my hat
 It's going dark; the tree branch
 In dark woods, umbrella by me
 Green water, orange, white stripes
 Dark, dark the monkey, the dog.*
